**Thea Davis**, MEd, BCBA, Clinical Director and Owner, Autism Bridges Inc. Ms. Davis is the Founder and Clinical Director of Autism Bridges, Inc. and Social Bridges of New England in Bedford, NH and a specialist in providing intensive Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) for children diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorders. She is responsible for the overall operation of the company and the quality of the clinical services. Autism Bridges employs more than 40 professionals who provide school, home, and community based service enabling clients to use insurance to access behavioral and social cognitive therapy services in New Hampshire. Ms. Davis graduated from the University of Pennsylvania with a Master's of Science in Education. She went on to receive her Board Certification in Behavior Analysis (BCBA) from the University of North Texas and is currently enrolled in Simmons College as a merit scholar in the Ph.D. program in Applied Behavior Analysis. She is the founder and past president of NHABA, has been a guest editor of Behavior Analysis in Practices, an Expert Panel Member of the Autism Society of New Hampshire and an Expert Witness on ABA Efficacy and Guidelines. Ms. Davis enjoys frequent public speaking opportunities and is regularly requested to serve as a consultant or expert witness in related cases.

**Danielle Tibert**, M. Ed., BCBA, Director, Home and Community Programing, Constellations Behavioral Services, LLC. Ms. Tibert has worked with Constellations since 2013. Prior to joining this behavioral organization, she was a clinical instructor for children diagnosed with autism spectrum disorders and later, the Director of the Social Enrichment Program with Applied Behavioral Learning Services in Massachusetts. She became interested in social skills instruction while completing her master's thesis. Ms. Tibert has successfully completed training and certification in the only evidenced based social skills training program currently available, The Program for the Education and Enrichment of Relational Skills (PEERS®). Mrs. Tibert earned a BA in Education and BS in Psychology from Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts, holds a Masters in Special Education from Lesley University, and a Certification in Advanced Graduate Study in Applied Behavior Analysis for Special Populations from the University of Massachusetts, Boston. **Peg Chaffee**, MA, BCBA, LABA, State Clinical Director, The Institute of Professional Practice, Inc. (IPPI)

Ms. Chaffee's experience in the field expands more than three decades and she currently oversees the provision of all consultation services provided by IPPI, NH. She has been a Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) since 2005 and as such has provided behavioral consultation to schools, families and area agencies throughout New Hampshire. Ms. Chaffee has performed functional assessments, written and overseen behavior intervention plans, and provided training in various aspects of behavior analysis. She is a trainer in Safety Care, behaviorally-based crisis intervention techniques, and has taught similar curricula (S.O.L.V.E., S.U.P.P.O.R.T.) since 1989. Her education includes a Bachelor's Degree in Psychology (St. Anselm College) and a Master of Arts in Education with a concentration in behavior analysis (Johnson State College). Ms. Chaffee also teaches Applied Behavior Analysis at Antioch University New England in Keene, NH.

**Le'Ann Milinder**, PhD, BCBA-D, New Hampshire State Director, The Institute of Professional Practice, Inc.

Dr. Milinder is a Board Certified Behavior Analyst – Doctoral level (BCBA-D®) who leads the NH programs of IPPI, a multi-state non-profit serving children and adults with developmental disabilities and other special needs. Dr. Milinder previously served as IPPI-NH's Clinical Director, overseeing all clinical services and working as a behavioral consultant to families and schools implementing early intensive behavioral interventions for autism, developing educational programming for children with disabilities, and addressing challenging behaviors. Dr. Milinder is the current President of the Private Provider Network in NH, Vice-President of the New Hampshire Association of Behavior Analysis, and member of the State Advisory Committee for Children with Disabilities. She holds a doctoral degree in Psychology, with a specialty in Behavior Analysis, and a master's degree in teaching. Dr. Milinder has taught Applied Behavior Analysis and Psychology courses at Antioch New England, UNH, New England College, Johnson State College, and Fitchburg State College. Dr. Milinder has worked in the developmental disabilities field since 1987.
